- African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American, or Hispanic American:
- Citizen, national or legal permanent resident of the U.S.;
- Cumulative GPA of 3.3 on an unweighted 4.0 scale, or have earned a GED;
- Enroll for the first time at a U.S. college or university in the Fall of 2016, as a full time, degree seeking first year student.

- Recipient must have a major in the natural resources discipline such as: wildlife, fisheries, forestry, biology, zoology, marine science, environmental science to qualify. (NOTE: Agriculture, general biology, pre-medical biology, and veterinary science are NOT eligible for this scholarship.)
- Recipient must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or above for a given academic year to receive funds for the following year.
